Changes to our fee policy

As of January 1, 2018:

All payments made through bank transfer or bank deposit are to **use the unique student account number as the reference**. Families with more than one child share an account, thus also share an account number. **Payments without such reference will not be acknowledged**. Invoices will be issued on a termly basis. **Account numbers will be included in the invoice**. Practically, this means that from January, 2018, we need **the student account number rather than the student name in order for the payment to be acknowledged**. No receipts will be issued without proof of payment and school fees will be deemed unpaid until proper documentation has been received by the Bursar. Note that it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to furnish the school **with** payment documentation. Please keep all records pertaining your school account; invoices, receipts, proof of payments and notes from the bursar's for future reference.
