## Parent Teacher Meeting...



**Wednesday, February 27 is our Parent-Teacher Meeting for Term One.** We are excited for the opportunity to meet with you. Our meetings start at **3pm**.

**Parents should collect their children at 1PM on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup>.**

Late fees will apply for children left on campus. The campus will close at 1:30 PM and reopen at 3PM. Our teachers will be here to meet you until 6PM. We expect all parents to attend on this day, unless there is an emergency. Special appointments will not be arranged for those who do not choose to attend.

### **Educational/Occupational Therapy.**

During the course of your child's education at The Learning Centre we may ask you to visit an educational psychologist. For some reason, many parents resist this. The truth is that the earlier we can intervene the better the results.

The Heads of Department at The Learning Centre work together with the teachers to observe any behavioral or academic issues we believe to be of serious concern. If you are requested to do this, please do not consider it a shameful thing. We all need help at different times and in different ways. It takes four times as long to intervene in Fourth Grade than during Reception or in the early years of Lower Primary which is when most struggles become known. While it is certainly never too late to seek help regarding your child's speech and language difficulties, treatment is most successful, less expensive, and takes the shortest amount of time when a parent or loved one is able to pick up on the earliest signs of these disorders. One should not assume a child will 'outgrow' speech or language difficulties. There is never harm in seeking an assessment with a Speech-Language Therapist or Educational Psychologist whether it results in putting a parent's mind at ease or identifying a potential issue in a child that can be treated. In young children, early treatment can help prevent them from falling behind academically, socially, and in other key areas at a critical time in their development.
